

## **Chester Group**

The Chester Group is one of twelve local groups within the Family History Society of Cheshire.

Monthly meetings are held on the last Thursday of the month at 7.30 pm at Upton by Chester Pavilion, Wealstone Lane, Chester CH2 1HD. Upton Pavilion is on the south western side of Wealstone Lane, the sign at the entrance is Upton Village Surgery, and the building in the left hand corner of the car park next to the tennis courts. Members from all FHSC groups, new members and visitors are always welcome.

Most meetings feature a speaker on an aspect of family history or local interest. As well as a talk there is a family history help desk and the opportunity to discuss family history topics with other members. There is a small charge of £2 for members and £3 for visitors which includes coffee or tea at the end of the meeting.

The Group also runs a family history help desk at Chester Library at Storyhouse, Hunter Street, Chester CH1 2AR, from 10–12 am every Tuesday which is open to everyone looking for help with their family history.
