RESEARCH HELP WANTED

I have been contacted by Ron Matthews from Australia, enquiring about **George Toft**, born in Macclesfield about 1818.

In 1835 George was sent to prison for 4 months for larceny. In 1838, he was again convicted of larceny and was transported to New South Wales for 7 years, where he remained until his death in 1882. The NSW BDM index states that his parents were George and Margaret Toft.

Ron has searched Familysearch, Ancestry and the Cheshire Parish Clerks Project but can't find a marriage for George and Margaret Toft.
